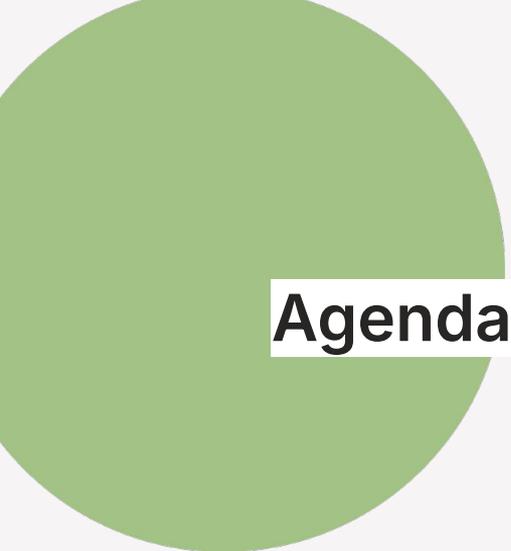



## Application process

- **Thank you** screen when successfully submitted application
- Editor may need to contact you during review process - **if no response from you after 1 month**, application will be rejected
- Check **Spam/Junk folder** for emails from DOAJ

---

## Rejection (1)

- Email with **reasons** for rejection
- Re-submit application **6 months** after date of rejection
- 3 exceptions for this 6 months period waiting time:
  - Unconfirmed ISSN
  - Website unavailable
  - Insufficient content published





---

## Rejection (2)

- Information submitted via application form must be **accurate**
- Publisher not adhering to best practice, untrue or misleading information, questionable publishing practices - DOAJ will disallow further applications from publisher for **3 years**

---

## Rejection (3)

- Journals/publishers with multiple exclusions totalling **6+ years**, will not be considered for inclusion in DOAJ
- Journals no longer adhering to DOAJ criteria will be **removed**
- Make 100% sure journal adheres to criteria before re-applying

---

## Appeals (1)

### When ?

You may submit an appeal if your journal has been removed from DOAJ or your application has been rejected and no new application is allowed for at least a year.



---

## Appeals (2)

- Submit appeal to **DOAJ Appeals Committee**
- Appeal should contain:
  - Journal title
  - Journal ISSN
  - Reason for appeal
  - Evidence for DOAJ Appeals Committee to consider
  - Original notification of rejection/removal

## Appeals (2)

- Appeals Committee meets monthly
- Committee member will contact you with outcome of appeal
- No further communication will be entered into after the appeal is heard and Committee had made decision

- 
- Open access journals in **any language**, from **any country**
    - Fully open access, no embargoes
    - Indicate **year** when journal content became open access
  - Journal must be actively publishing scholarly research
    - Any research **subject area**
    - Publish at least **5 research articles per year**
    - Primary **target audience** should be researchers or practitioners
  - Journals should adhere to the Principles of Transparency and Best Practice in Scholarly Publishing

---

## PRINCIPLES OF TRANSPARENCY AND BEST PRACTICE IN SCHOLARLY PUBLISHING

The **Committee on Publication Ethics** (COPE), the **Directory of Open Access Journals** (DOAJ), the **Open Access Scholarly Publishing Association** (OASPA), and the **World Association of Medical Editors** (WAME) are scholarly organisations that have collaborated to identify principles of transparency and best practice for scholarly publications. This is the fourth version of a work in progress (published September 15 2022). We encourage its wide dissemination.



- 
- Newly launched journals
    - Before applying to DOAJ, a new or flipped journal must demonstrate a **publishing history of more than 1 year** or have published at least **10 open access research articles**

---

- **Author charges**

- Even state if journal doesn't have any charges
- Must include all fees that may be charged to author, from submission to publication. Possible fees:
  - Submission fees
  - Editorial processing charges
  - Article processing charges (APCs)
  - Page charges
  - Colour charges

---

- **Author charges**

- Specify any waiver clearly, incl. conditions of waiver
- If there are charges for withdrawing article after submission, these charges cannot exceed the author charges

- **Contact details**

- Name of contact person and journal's dedicated email address
- Country must be where publisher is registered and carries out business activities

- 
- Editorial board should consist of **at least 5 editors** with appropriate qualifications and expertise - from different institutions
  - **Endogeny** should be minimised
    - Proportion of published papers where at least one of the authors is an editor, editorial board member, or reviewer, must not exceed 25%
    - Where content is not divided into issues, for example in a continuous publication model, endogeny must not exceed 25% in the last calendar year (minimum 5 articles per year).

---

## Special issues

- Editor-in-Chief must be responsible for content of entire journal
- Articles must be peer-reviewed, clearly labelled
- Guest editor's credentials must be checked and approved
- Editor-in-Chief or dedicated board members must oversee guest editors
- Papers submitted by guest editor(s) must be peer-reviewed and not be more than 25% of issue's total

---

# Additional criteria for some journal types



---

## Arts and humanities journals

- Editorial review is acceptable
- Must be handled by minimum 2 editors

---

## Clinical case reports journals

- Only considered if it includes retrospective analysis of 3 or more clinical cases or a literature review
- Must at least publish 5 articles per year

---

## Conference proceedings journals

- Journal must have ISSN and permanent editorial/advisory board
- Peer-reviewed, full text conference papers must be available  
Individual conference proceedings will not be indexed

---

## Data journals

- Journals publishing research articles about data or datasets are accepted
- Journals that link to datasets/announce their availability will not be accepted

---

## Overlay journals

- Will accept journals that select and peer-review articles hosted on a preprint server/other site

---

## Student-run journals

- Must have advisory board where at least 2 members have a PhD/equivalent

---

## Flipped journals

- Display date of change, availability of archive material, reuse rights of archival material
- All content published after flipped date must be completely open access - must have at least 10 open access journals published for inclusion in DOAJ

---

## Mirror journals

- Fully open access version of subscription journal; may have similar name as subscription journal, but must have different ISSN
- Currently accepted if basic criteria are met

## Book review journals

- Journals only consisting of book reviews will not be accepted

## Digital preservation (archiving) policy

Journal content must be continuously deposited in one of these archives:

- Any archiving agency included in Keepers Registry
- Internet Archive
- PubMed Central
- JASPER

Authors must be permitted to deposit all versions of their paper in an institutional/subject repository:

- Preprint
- Author's accepted manuscript
- Published article
- No embargo may apply

## Persistent article identifiers

Articles should use persistent article identifiers:

- DOI, ARK, Handles
- All persistent links must resolve correctly



## Transfer of metadata

When publishers send us their article metadata, it increases the visibility of both the journal and its articles.

You can share your metadata in three different ways:

- API (Application Programming Interface) - API key
- XML (Extensible Markup Language) - XML file
- Manual entry of metadata - Online form





## Widgets

Widgets are tools that allow you to embed DOAJ into your site. There are two widgets available:

1. A Simple Journal Search widget which embeds a search box on your page. Upon submitting the search, the user is taken to their journal search results on DOAJ.
2. A Fixed Query widget which allows you to embed, into your site, a specific set of results from a predefined DOAJ search.

Full data-dumps of the entire journal and article metadata are generated weekly. The files are in JSON format and are in the same form as those retrieved via the API.

Each file is a `tar.gz`.

An [exportable version of the journal metadata](#) is also available (CSV format) for immediate download.
