KEY POINTS

- Independent and engaging learning activity.
- Support various individual learning goals – grasp minimal concepts or get more in-depth knowledge of the subject.
- Standalone displays allowed library users to get informed without having to do the Quest.
- Mix of information gathering techniques, on the displays and online search.
- Adaptable activity for other institutions to reuse and build-upon.

SUGGESTIONS

- **Go digital** and engage Voyagers by completing the Quest on mobile devices (e.g. ActionBound).
- Attract participation with a **prize**.
- **Adapt your topics, materials and activities** depending on your audience.
- **Make the Quest dynamic** by scattering it over a larger area and by designing interactive/gamified activities.
- Learning with others - **provide collaborative activities** (e.g. whiteboard, social media, group activity).


