


# OpenCitations eBook










OpenCitations is an **open infrastructure** organization leader in the advocacy for open citations.



"For fourteen years it has been my dream that the citation graph linking the scholarly publications of the global academic community should be available openly and without re-use restriction. From a slow start, OpenCitations has grown to be the world's leading repository of open academic citations, and we have now started to host the bibliographic metadata for the citing and cited works involved in our indexed citations. We have ambitious plans to expand our coverage significantly during 2023, both in terms of subject disciplines and geographical spread, offering a viable alternative to the citation indexes offered by commercial companies, and we hope that our data will help facilitate a global transition to transparent and reproducible research assessment."



"Openness has been part of my personal growth since I was a student in Computer Science at the University of Bologna, where I first touched the open-source world related to software. This imprinting has been a leitmotiv of what I have done in research and Open Science infrastructures in the past ten years. OpenCitations inherits this mindset in all the artefacts released and activities it has been involved in. Open data, Open Access publications, Open-source software, community governance: everything is provided to foster better transparency and enable a better science – or, to recall a well-known slogan in the Open Science community, *science done right*."





Its data is published under a Creative Commons CCO Public Domain Waiver, and may be freely reused for any purpose, including commercial purposes




# OpenCitations services



#### OpenCitations records growth

Until December 2021, OpenCitations main database was COCI, the OpenCitations Index of Crossref Open DOI-to-DOI Citations, which stores citation metadata, together with DOI identifiers for the citing and cited publications.

In December 2022, OpenCitations released two new indexes (**POCI-citations from PubMed** and **DOCI-citations from DataCite**) and a new database, **OpenCitations Meta**, thus significantly increasing the number of records indexed and covered by OpenCitations.



#### **Business Model**

OpenCitations charges nothing to access its services. It is free and will always remain free. This means that OpenCitations' activities generate no income to sustain its operations. So far, OpenCitations has supported its activities, including the appointment of team members and the maintenance of its technical infrastructure, in three ways.
